

Karnataka trying to create constitutional crisis: TN

Farmers call for Centre's interference

Chennai, 22 September

Political parties in Tamil Nadu alleged the attempt of Karnataka government to defer releasing of Cauvery water till September 23 to create constitutional crisis and warned them not to politicise the issue. Supreme Court had ordered Karnataka to release 6,000 cusecs a day to the state from September 21 to 27.

The opposition party Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) said, Chief Minister J Jayalalithaa has to open her eyes and come with adequate steps without wasting time.

The ruling All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK), while taking credit of the SC's directive to the Centre to form Cauvery Board in four weeks, said that a state government defying the directions of SC is not a good sign.

"The Karnataka government should have conveyed their opinion to the Court. They don't have the power to defy the order of SC and the statement made by the Karnataka Chief Minister on Wednesday will only worsen the law and order situation there," said C R Saravathi, AIADMK leader. She added that the Tamil Nadu government has taken all efforts to protect the Kannadigas in the State, while the Karnataka is trying to

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befit the people's problems. If SC has asked the Centre to form Cauvery Water Management Board, it is because of the efforts of Tamil Nadu Chief Minister J Jayalalithaa, she said.

DMK supremo M Karunanidhi asked whether the State Chief Minister on Wednesday would call for an all party meeting to take decision on the issue.

He alleged that it is a shameless situation where the state government has not called for an all party meeting or even ministers meeting to discuss the ways to

befit the people's problems. If SC has asked the Centre to form Cauvery Water Management Board, it is because of the efforts of Tamil Nadu and Karnataka government? Don't they think that the government of Tamil Nadu is sleeping?" he said.

The decision of Karnataka government to convene a session to discuss about the order could lead to a political-legal problem, said S Ramdoss, founder of regional political party Pattali Makkal Katchi (PMK).

In a statement, he said the special

session of the legislative assembly may pass a resolution against the water release, which would then be a problem between the judiciary and the legislature. Meanwhile, farmers' organisations are seeking the Centre's support to resolve the issue. P R Pandian, leader of Cauvery Delta All Farmers Associations' Coordination Committee, said that it is high time for the Prime Minister to interfere in the issue and ask Karnataka to obey the SC orders.

It expects the industry to reverse the decline in seafood exports during the last financial year which saw 945,892 MT of seafood export valued at \$4.7 billion. "Aquaculture is a very significant area for marine exports as far as India is concerned and our efforts are geared towards greater technology inputs and product diversification in this area," said A Jayathilak, MPEDA Chairman.

"Our higher target for exports this year is in part due to increased production of globally in-demand

tiger shrimp, and diversification of aquaculture species particularly of Mangrove Crab and Tilapia", he added. India targets to achieve an export turnover of US\$ 10 billion by the year 2020. The MPEDA is supporting shrimp culture through cluster farming approach. More than 10,000 farmers have been organized into aquasocieties who are implementing 'Better Management Practices'. The aquasocieties are also helping the farmers to access credit, quality seeds, feeds and other inputs, reducing the burden

GMB's minor ports clock higher traffic growth than major ones

GMB, which administers and regulates the 41 state-owned non-major ports of Gujarat has managed to grow its traffic by 47 per cent thereby raising its share in the overall

Indian port traffic from 26 per cent in FY11 to 32 per cent in FY16.

As against this, during the same five-year period, traffic at major ports in India grew by just six per cent.

GMB ports handled 340 mt of cargo in FY16 up from a 231

million tonne (mt) in FY11. During the same period, the overall traffic handled at Indian ports (major and non-major) grew by 21 per cent from 885 mt in FY11 to 1,073 mt in FY16.
